Motivating Scripture Memorisation

A plan consists of:

- Know it is God's will for your sanctification.
- Commit to making it a life habit .
- Begin with familiar verses or short simple verses, always including references.
- Don't overload yourself with too many verses at once, give yourself time to meditate on every verse memorised.
- Set the same time and place every day to memorise, eg make it part of your regular morning worship.
- Always pray before memorising. Claim John 14:26
- Memorise aloud, have an accountability partner to recite to once a week.
 - Learn word perfect including the reference. Say reference, then verse, then reference



As each goose flaps its wings, it creates 'uplift' for the bird following; by flying in a "V" formation the whole flock adds 71% more flying range than if each bird flew alone.

Lesson: People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are travelling on the thrust of one another.

When a goose falls out of formation it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to fly alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front.

Lesson: If we have as much sense as a goose, we will join in formation with those who are headed where we want to go.

When the lead goose gets tired, it retreats back into the formation and another goose flies at the point position.

Lesson: It pays to take turns doing the lead tasks and sharing leadership with people as with geese - interdependent with one another.

The geese in formation honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up the speed. Lesson: We need to make sure our honking from behind is encouraging - not something less than helpful.

When a goose gets sick or wounded or shot down, two geese drop out of formation and follow their fellow member down to help provide protection. They stay with this member of the flock until he or she is able to fly again or dies. Then they launch out on their own, with another formation or to catch up with their own flock.

Lesson: If we have as much sense as the geese, we'll stand by one another like they do.
